Pink Band Project

Improving communication between long-term & acute care teams

WHO is involved?

Long-term care facilities, emergency departments, and in-patient acute care units in south Vancouver Island.

WHAT

Signals to acute care staff that the patient wearing a pink band on their wrist lives at a long-term care home (a facility with FT nursing care), and that verbal communication with the LTC home nurse is necessary.

WHEN do I use it?

When a resident is transferred to the emergency department from their long-term care home.

WHERE does it apply?

At all Island Health owned and operated, and affiliated long-term care homes. Private long-term care homes may also choose to use it.

WHY

To facilitate communication and handover between health care staff.

LEADERSHIP, please

- Inform nurses about the initiative & how it works
- Provide IDRAW tools
- Provide pink wrist bands
- Ensure the Island Health COMPLEX CARE Resident ED Transfer
 Form (or equivalent) is printed on pink paper.
